## Healthy Lunchboxes

Just a reminder that we ask for parent and carer support in ensuring that pupil lunchboxes reflect healthy choices. Fizzy pop, sweets, chocolate bars and fruit cordials (drinks) are not permitted. Any uneaten food (aside of yogurt) will remain in pupil's lunchboxes to allow parents and carers to be advised exactly what has been consumed at lunchtime by their child(ren).

## Accident Forms

Many of you will already be aware of our procedures in school for recording and informing you of any accidents or bumps that your child may encounter whilst at school. When children are active outside, they inevitably may fall, slip or bump into one another.

At Lee Brigg Infant and Nursery school, we have made the decision to inform parents directly of **ANY** incident that may occur should a child bump **ANY** part of their body above their shoulders whilst at school e.g. bumped noses, cheeks, heads etc. We record these as incidents as a 'head injury' and they are treated accordingly (usually with an ice pack or

cold compress). We are aware that by taking this approach, a child may appear to be having number of 'head injury' incidents over the course of a week, most of which are minor, day-to-day and appropriate to the child's age.

The yellow forms that we use to inform you of such incidents will provide additional details. As we are very cautious in our approach, an additional form is **ALWAYS** sent home when a child has encountered a bump which we would categorise as a 'head injury' (any part of their body above their shoulders).

## School Uniform and Lost Property

A huge thank you to parents and carers whom have labelled their child's uniform. This has greatly assisted in reducing the number of items of lost property. We do however have one item of lost property (a red 'woodbank' cardigan with school logo age 5/6) which unfortunately is un-named.
