Dear Parents and Carers,

### **Phased Re-opening Of School**

We have continued to welcome back increasing numbers of our pupils in eligible groups (Nursery, Reception and Year 1) as part of our phased reopening of school. A HUGE thank you once more to our parents and carers for observing social distance restrictions in place and conforming to health and safety guidance in line with our risk assessment of the school premises; your efforts assisted with a smooth transition into school for pupils.

Our school 'bubbles' have now reached full capacity and we are therefore presently not able to welcome any additional pupils into school. Should you be considered a 'critical worker' (such as employed by the emergency services) and you wish your child to return to school then we would ask that you contact the school office in the first instance. We will do all we can within Government guidance and risk assessment procedure to accommodate any critical worker requests, however we would ask for your patience whilst we review and consider options.

#### **Healthy Lunches and Snacks**

Just a reminder that for those pupils in school (Reception-Year 2) school are able to provide a 'grab bag' (which contains a sandwich, fruit, yogurt, biscuit and salad) for lunch. Alternatively, pupils are able to bring a packed lunch from home. We ask that parents and carers give their full support and ensure that pupil lunchboxes brought in from home reflect healthy choices. Fizzy pop, sweets, chocolate bars and fruit cordials (drinks) are not permitted.

Unfortunately, due to Government restrictions in place the School Fruit and Vegetable Service (SFVS) are not able to supply fruit for snack time. From Monday 22nd June 2020, we welcome parents / carers to supply fruit for morning snack should they wish.

#### Arriving Late and Advising Of Absence

We would like to remind parents and carers of those pupils who have returned to school of the importance of being punctual. Our risk assessment has been designed to ensure that pupils are welcomed into school in a phased approach to minimise both the number of people on site and the number of visitors to the school office. We reserve the right to refuse admission for those pupils who are habitually late in attending school. Should your child not be able to attend school for any reason, we would request that you advise school prior to 8:50am on 01924 893829 as we will continue to progress our first response process under our safeguarding responsibilities for those who do not attend and have not made contact with school.

#### Site Safety

Please could we remind parents and carers that cycling within the school grounds is not permitted. We would ask that you and your child dismount bicycles prior to entering the school grounds.

#### Transitions

In preparation for transitions in September 2020, we have created a 'transitions' tab on our school website (<u>http://www.leebrigg.wakefield.sch.uk/transitions</u>). We have a transition plan in place for each cohort within our school as well as those who will be joining and those who will be moving on from our school. We will be updating these pages with further information, including videos to welcome pupils in nursery and reception.

For those due to join Nursery or who will remain in Nursery – we have made available an information pack / letter and have contacted parents / carers by telephone

For those due to transition to Reception (from Nursery) - we have made available an information pack / letter and have contacted parents / carers by telephone

For those due to transition to Year 1 (from Reception) – Update will be given week commencing Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July For those due to transition to Year 2 (from Year 1) – Update will be given week commencing Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July









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**For those transitioning to Junior School** – we hope for those transitioning to Altofts Junior School that you had opportunity to visit this week and meet your new class teacher. Miss Kilkenny will be contacting Year 2 parents / Carers (and pupils) who remain at home next week by telephone to check how you all are and to allow you to ask any questions you may have regarding transitions. For those transitioning to alternate junior schools we have made contact with these settings and will update you individually regarding transition planning.

We will be in touch with Year 2 parents in regards to alternative plans we have in place to mark their transition to junior school in the coming weeks.

#### **School Photographs**

Mrs Dixon-Child has made contact with Tempest Photography to enquire as to whether they would be able to facilitate a 'socially distanced photograph session' with them. We had hoped that they may be able to support individual / family photographs and possibly superimpose pupils onto a 'class' photograph. Unfortunately, Tempest photography remain closed for the foreseeable future under current government restrictions and there is therefore no option to arrange school photographs with them. As the restrictions will affect the photographic industry as a whole, we regrettably will not be able to go ahead with school photographs this academic year. We appreciate this may be disappointing for parents / carers; however we must respect Government guidance to uphold the safety of all on the school premises.

#### **Cycle Skills**

This week, our Year 2 pupils would have met with their friends from schools around the local community to participate in our annual 'cycle skills' event. Unfortunately, this event has been cancelled due to Government Coronavirus restrictions. Whilst it is by no means a replacement, we would direct you to a <u>Bikeability Tools For Schools</u> pack, which you can participate in should you wish. Please do send photos in should you manage to get out and about on your bikes (whilst observing restrictions in place) as we would love to see these!

#### **School Uniform**

#### **Home Learning**

Just to reassure those pupils who remain at home; staff will continue to keep in touch with you by telephone, and will continue to update the home learning pages of our school website with non-compulsory suggestions for home learning. As our teaching staff are now back in school full time, we have less capacity to provide paper home learning packs as frequently as we have done previously. Should anyone have difficulties in accessing 'online' home learning and require additional support, please contact the school office in the first instance.

I know that many parents / carers enjoyed chatting with Mr Brooks whilst on site, and for some of you there will not be opportunity for you to say goodbye in person. Therefore, if anyone has any messages of thanks or best wishes they would like to be passed on to Mr Brooks then please do get in touch and we will ensure that these are conveyed.

#### Value of the half term

We are inviting both those learning within school and those learning at home to complete a number of planned activities at home and for parents and carers to help by sending in scores.
