



Dates for you diary: **Our 'maths stay and play' session will take place on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> March.** We ask that adults return to nursery at 10.30am (morning session) and 2.30pm (afternoon session). If you are unable to attend, a grandparent or other family member/friend can come to support your child. The session will give you the opportunity to watch a nursery maths session, following this you will have time to play maths games in the areas of provision with your child.

**Our 'Easter stay and play session' will take place on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> April.** At this session, the children will decorate an Easter hat that they will have made in nursery. We will provide decorations, glue, scissors etc. however, you are very welcome to bring along your own Easter decorations. The pound shop has loads! The session will begin at 10.30am for the children who attend nursery in the morning and 2.30pm for the children who attend nursery in the afternoon. It will last for approximately 45minutes. Children should come to nursery at the normal time. We kindly ask that toddlers do not attend the session. If you are unable to attend for any reason, grandparents, a family friend or relative can take your place. **The children will wear the Easter hat that they make at our Easter bonnet parade on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> April.** On this day, adults will need to return to nursery at 10.45am for the children who attend Nursery in the Morning and 2.45pm for the children who attend nursery in the afternoon.

We will be holding an Easter raffle and tickets will go on sale on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March. The raffle will be drawn at our Easter parade.

After the holidays, our sound of the week will be 'n'. Please support your child to bring an object into nursery for our sound table, such as net or nectarine. Can we please ask that you name the object that you bring in to avoid someone taking the wrong object home?

Our key text (week1) will be 'Mr Wolfs Pancakes', and of course we will make pancakes! Our number of the week will be five. The rhyme we will learn is, 'down and around and a flag on high that's the way we make a five.'

Over the next few weeks, we will learn about how things change and we hope to incubate eggs. We will also plant beans and observe the changes and learn about the Easter story.
