



This week's learning: The children have enjoyed playing 'Halloween parties'. This has enabled the children to work as part of a group and act out real life experiences.

Baking hedgehogs was an activity that enabled the children to develop their physical skills and listening skills (rolling, mixing, pinching and following instructions).

Please remember to ask your child to tell you something that they have learnt about hedgehogs.

Next week's learning: We will have a Halloween frenzy! We will continue to role-play Halloween parties and create magic spells in the water area (we will introduce lots of 'magical' vocabulary). We will make a sandwich for the party and make Halloween decorations. We will also learn about 'spiders.'

Our story of the week will be 'Meg and Mog' and our rhyme of the week will be 'I have a little spider.' We will use the Halloween cutters in the playdough area and to challenge the children further, we will add witches fingers. Have you ever tried to manipulate playdough with witches' fingers?

In letters and sounds, we will focus on 'questions and instructions' and alliteration.

In maths, we will continue to count daily, we will sort objects and our number rhyme will be '5 Little Pumpkins.'
