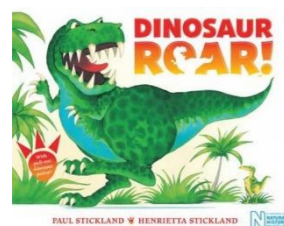

**DINOSAUR ROAR!** "A lovely rhythmic poem that small children love to recite."

The rhythm of the text will soon have the children chanting along. The most expressive of dinosaurs introduce young children to the idea of opposites. The wonderful illustrations and a text full of rhyme and rhythm, make this a book to revisit endlessly.

Here are some activities for you to try at home. This is not a tick list for you to work down, choose your favourites and do them as many times as you like – repeating them is good! Don't forget to email all your dinosaur learning to us.

#### **Communication and Language:**

- Introduce new vocabulary such as meek and expose children to alternative words such as shy or timid.
- Give your child verbal instructions to make a fruit dinosaur.
- Ask the following questions and together find out the answers.
  - Would a dinosaur eat me?
  - How big is a dinosaur? (Would they fit in my school bag?)
  - Would a dinosaur's roar hurt my ears?



Can you find a dinosaur? Where are dinosaurs now?

#### **Literacy**

- Can you clap the syllables of dinosaurs?- steg-o-saur-us (4 claps) ty-rann-o-saur-us-rex (6 claps)
- Play the silly soup rhyming game. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=78RW5E4Efc8>
- Play Kim's Game- place a selection of objects on a tray, cover them up, take one away without anyone seeing. Can they tell you which on is missing. Make it more difficult by taking 2 or 3 away!
- Can you practise writing your name? Remember the capital letter is at the beginning and then all the other letters are lower case.

## Physical Development

- Can you build a tower of stones/rocks? How tall can you build it before it falls over?
- Can you make some dinosaur bones for salt dough?

- Learn how to wipe your nose, remember to wash your hands afterwards.

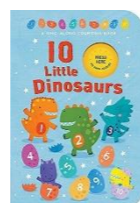


## Maths

- Practise your counting. Recite numbers to 10.
- Make groups of objects



- Make some dinosaurs, add a number to each of them and attach the correct number of pegs to represent spikes.
- Learn about number 1. Count to 1, find 1 object, 1 action, such as clap, stamp, look at the numeral 1, match number to quantity- 1 object and the numeral 1
