This week our book is 'Letters around the World'. The book is about a little girl called Emily who wants a pen pal. The book begins with Emily writing a letter about herself. After reading the letter about Emily, the children thought about how they are similar and different to Emily. They thought about where they live, what they like to eat and drink and what they like to do. The children then made books about themselves. Next week we will be reading a letter from a little boy who lives in Africa.

Can you help your child discover different countries by looking at where the different foods they eat come from? Have a look on the packaging of fruit and vegetables. Can you then find the countries on a map?

The children have been using their cutting and collage skills to make a split pin person and dress them. They have used mirrors to look closely at their features and draw or painted a self-portrait.

In maths, they have been looking at number 9 and number 10. They have found dominoes that add up to 9 and played 'Ten in the bed'. Today they used the sand timers to see what they could do in a minute. You could challenge them at home to see how many toys they can put away in a minute!

Our Stars this week are Harry, for super effort with his challenges and Emily for showing that she can work sensibly with a partner in PE.
