






At Lee Brigg Nursery, we give your children, 'The roots to grow and wings to fly.' We are looking forward to working in partnership with you all, to enable your children to become independent learners.

Next week (WC 19<sup>th</sup> April), we would like to add plants and flowers to our investigation area. We would be very grateful if anyone could donate a plant or some flowers for the children to explore and investigate. We would like the children to explore a variety of plants/flowers such as plants that smell (herbs), cactus plants, plants that flower, large plants, small plants or plants with unusual leaves.

Our topic for this half term is 'Ready, Steady Grow'. We will learn about how humans change and observe how plants and animals grow and change. Please can your child bring a photograph into nursery of when they were a baby. Please write your child's name on the back of the photograph. The photograph will be returned to you once it has been displayed in the nursery.

This week's learning: Our key text will be 'When I was a Baby'. We will learn the nursery rhyme 'Rock a bye baby.' Our maths activities will include counting and subitising and our maths story will be 'Ten Little Fingers and Ten Little Toes.'

In Letters and Sounds we will continue to focus on conceptual vocabulary. Our circle time activity will be to talk about how we grow/change and what being healthy means.
