




Firstly, thank you to everyone who has donated a plant. The children have been artists, (drawing some of the plants and flowers) and scientists. They used all of their senses to explore the plants and did a good job looking after them.

This week's learning: Our key text will be 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar.' A great story to learn about the days of the week, healthy and un-healthy food and the life cycle of a butterfly. Our live caterpillars should arrive this week so that we can see the cycle in 'real life'.

In Letters and Sounds we will focus on memory, initial sounds and syllables.

Our song for the week will be, 'There's a Tiny Caterpillar on a Leaf.'

Our maths activities will involve learning about days of the week, different times of the day and measurements.
