In maths, we have continued to practise subtraction and one fewer. We have consolidated our understanding of the language of **first**, **then** and **now**. We have enjoyed playing subtraction games in maths this week.

In our creative work this week, we have been drawing and painting spring flowers. We have used oil pastels to draw with; we used printing to add detail to our flowers.
