

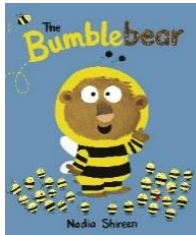


This week's learning: Our key text will be 'The Bumble Bear' by Nadia Shereen

This book provides lots of opportunities to talk about differences, feelings and friendships and will also enable the children to discuss the different parts of a day. We will learn facts about bees, learn lots of new vocabulary and in wake up shake up we will learn 'The Waggle Dance'

We will continue to be scientists and observe the caterpillars, beans and eggs. The eggs should hatch in approximately 4 days and the caterpillars should soon begin to form a chrysalis. They will stay inside it for 1- 2 weeks, we will inform you when the changes happen.

In 'Letters and Sounds', we will focus on alliteration, oral blending/segmenting and syllables.

In maths, we will continue to subitise and we will explore pattern.

Outdoors, we will act out 'The Hungry Caterpillar' story using props.

As you know at Lee Brigg Nursery, we give our children 'roots to grow and wings to fly'. It will soon be time for some of our children to use their wings and fly onto their next journey in life, school.

To prepare the children for school, we are currently practising dressing and undressing (shoes, socks, jumper and coat) using cutlery and encouraging the children to manage at the toilet (independently). Can we please ask that you encourage and support your child to practise these skills at home. We do understand that sometimes it is easier for adults to do it, however, the more independent the children are when moving up to school the better.

Now that the weather is getting warmer, can we please ask that your child brings a sun hat to nursery (please name it) and please apply sun cream before coming to nursery when necessary.

Can we please remind everyone to wear a mask when on the school grounds.
