
The children will take part in some physical activities in the school hall, as part of our transition programme. This will support the children who are moving to school in September.

Investors in Pupils is a simple concept to empower all pupils, increase motivation and contribute to raising achievement. It involves pupils in decision making and developing responsibility in relation to their learning. The children will bring their target home so that they can practise at home too.

The children have made their own playdough caterpillar and wrapped it inside a cocoon. We are hoping that our playdough caterpillars change into butterflies too! We will let you know if this happens.
