
This week's learning: We will revisit the text Brown Bear Brown Bear by Bill Martin Jr/Eric Carle. It is a simple, repetitive, rhyming text. You might like to sing along to the story at home,

We will rehearse some of the songs that we have learnt over the year in preparation for our end of year show.

To support the children moving to school in September will once again visit the school hall as part of our transition programme. Our maths activities will include making a shape bear and subitsing. We are getting really good at noticing different amounts when we drop the buttons in the tray (see below). You might want to try it at home.

We are still waiting for the caterpillars to manoeuvre their bodies into a chrysalis (cocoon) ready for metamorphosis to take place. We will update you as the changes happen.

Not only does it help with their ability to understand words, and learn new vocabulary, but it encourages them to begin to develop their imagination. It develops their speech, improves concentration and introduces children to new concepts and the world around them.

We are already beginning to see a difference, please continue to encourage them to practise, especially wiping their nose on a tissue and not their sleeve! 
