DATES FOR YOUR DIARY: Sponsored Nursery Rhyme Challenge: You are invited to come and watch the children perform some of the nursery rhymes that we have been learning. The date is Thursday 21st October at 11am for the morning session children and 2.45pm for the afternoon children. We kindly ask that the parents/carer of children who stay all day to come to the morning performance. Two adults per child may attend the performance.

This week's learning: We have had another busy week in nursery. Our story was 'Oliver's Wood' by Sue Hendra. We chose this story because of the descriptive vocabulary such as 'whizz', 'whee', 'scatter' and 'flutter'. As well as these words, our target vocabulary this week was: nocturnal, dim, stripy, bare hedgehog and Autumn. We have also learnt the vocabulary 'tumbled' and 'broom'. Please try and use all these words at home. Our golden pebbles jar is filling up! We are sure that very soon there will be enough golden pebbles which means the children can have a treat. **On the last day of this half term, Thursday 21st October, the children are invited to come to nursery wearing Halloween clothes and we will have a Halloween party. Please do not go and buy Halloween clothes (if you do not already have any), we have lots in nursery that the children will be able to borrow for the day.**

The children have manipulated the dough in different ways to make an owl or hedgehog. They have learnt lots of facts about owls and hedgehogs so please ask them a question such as 'What are hedgehogs good at?' Or 'What do owls/hedgehogs eat?'

In 'Letters and Sounds' the children boarded the listening bus. They needed to listen very carefully to identify the different sounds made by the instruments, such as the horn and the wipers.

The children have been artists this week. They followed pictorial instructions and painted an owl, their creations will soon be displayed in nursery for you to see.
