The children have enjoyed listening to various stories about The First Christmas.

Our target vocabulary this week: Jesus, Mary, Joseph, manger, Christmas celebrate, travel, feelings (happy, frightened, excited, tired). Please try and use these words at home.

The children have been writing their name, practising our Christmas songs and using the small world resources to create Christmas stories. We are now counting down the sleeps until Christmas and the children have been very patient and accepted that they have to wait for their turn when we open our Advent calendar.

Cheeky Elf has been very mischievous this week. The children have enjoyed working together to find him when he has escaped from his box!

The children have also acted out the Nativity story using the 'Helicopter Story' approach (an approach to develop communication and literacy skills based on Storytelling and Story Acting).
