This week's learning: We have had a busy week in nursery. The new children have settled in and seem to be enjoying nursery life! The children have enjoyed the new dressing up clothes and shoes. They have loved making sure the Dear Zoo characters don't escape and then rescuing the ones who have been trapped! (This is a great activity for fine motor skills, try it at home). Our key text was Dear Zoo by Rod Campbell. It is a simple story that has repetitive text and introduces children to adjectives.

Our target vocabulary this week: perfect, tall, grumpy, fragile and fierce. We have also introduced the children to the names of young animals, snakelet, calf (giraffe, elephant and camel), cub, froglet and infant (monkey). Please try and use these words at home.
