



Books: Reading is a top priority across Lee Brigg School. We want all of our children to foster a love of reading. In nursery we offer a library lending service. At the beginning of the nursery session we ask that you support your child in choosing a book to take home. Please read this book with them at home and talk about the story. Starting a reading routine early, sets young children up to continue reading and enjoying stories as they grow. It will improve their vocabulary, language and comprehension skills and they are more likely to do well at school.

January starters: If you would like to discuss how your child has settled into nursery, please make an appointment with Mrs Windsor or Mrs Hough.

September 2021 starters: We are often able to tell you about your child's progress or next steps at the beginning/end of the nursery session. We recognise that working in partnership with you is an important part of school life, so please just ask us if there is anything you want to know about your child's learning or nursery life.

This week's learning: We have had a busy week in nursery. Our key text was Goldilocks and the Three Bears. This traditional tale teaches the children about respect, keeping safe, size and likes and dislikes. We were very proud that all the children happily tasted the porridge, although some of them clearly didn't like it! The children acted out the story of Goldilocks and the Three bears in the home corner and at Helicopter story time. Our target vocabulary this week: hard, soft, nap, huge, tiny, plodded, golden, wailed. Please try and use these words at home.

Most of the children enjoyed their visit from Toby the dog, he was very well behaved (and so were the children).

In our circle time session, we learnt a new word, forgiveness.

If you have not already done so, we ask that you please bring your child's birth certificate into nursery as we have to verify their date of birth as part of our records.
