- In Wakefield 2 out of 10 children are classified as 'obese' This statistic rises to 2 out of 5 children by the time pupils reach Year 6
- Wakefield has an above national average percentage of obese children (22.7% of children in Year 6)

- Ensure children are offered and encouraged to eat a balanced diet
- Ensure children are offered the experience to try a range of different fruits vegetables and make 'healthy choices'
- Limit sugar intake (minimise sweets and fizzy drinks!)
