This week, we drew a picture of ourselves and a picture of a friend. We also mixed colours to paint a self-portrait. We used Autumn objects and coloured pegs to make repeating patterns and outside we made conker soup and lavender lotions in our outdoor kitchen. We made and tasted gingerbread men and most of us thought were delicious!

Our sounds (phonemes) this week were **ck, e, u, r**. When 2 letters make 1 sound (ck), it is called a digraph. We also learned the tricky word **I**. Thank you to everyone who is practising regularly at home! Please feel free to mix up the sounds on the keyring to try and 'trick' the children – they love this game at school! Remember to read at least 3 times at home and **don't forget to write in the reading record when you have read with your child!**

In maths we learned that

- **1 and another 1 is 2.**
- **1 and 1 and 1 makes 3.**

We will be using these 'stem' sentences to help us learn these facts. Please try and use them at home as often as you can!

Why not go for a walk this weekend and look for signs of Autumn. We still need more 'Autumn' objects so please collect conkers, acorns and pine cones and send them in to school.

The children enjoyed an extra PE session outside this week. They are doing really well getting dressed and undressed for PE but please encourage them to turn their own clothes the right way out when they take them off. We use the phrase '**grab and swoop**' to help with this.

Communication You can speak to an adult when you drop off or pick up your child at the end of each day. We ask that you wait until all children are in school or returned to a parent so we can ensure all children are safe.
