This week we wrote sentences about the Little Red Hen, using the sentences stem 'She is' or 'She has'. We also read the story 'Rosie's Walk' and used positional language to act out the story using story props. The Little Red Hen sent us a letter and a parcel with some fresh bread. We made toast, as she suggested, and enjoyed it with 'oodles of creamy butter' just like in the story.

In phonics, some children learnt 'ai' (tail in the rain) and 'ee' (sheep in a jeep) and some children learnt 'or' (born with a horn) and 'ur' (curl the fur). Please keep practising the key rings at home – it really does help your child to become a confident reader.

This week is 'Mental Health' week and the theme this year is 'Let's Connect'. We read Julia Donaldson's 'Room on the Broom' and discussed how we can connect with others. We also had an E-safety lesson, all about 'personal information'. We talked about how we should not share personal information with anyone on the internet. This includes our name, age, address, birthday and the town where we live. We watched 'Red visits the Dentist' and discussed the importance of dental hygiene.

In maths, we compared quantities. The children used the stem sentences:
 has more than and **has fewer than** .
The children did really well comparing the toys that Pat and Sam had. Please try and use these sentences at home to reinforce the learning.

We enjoyed the sunny weather outside and made bird feeders, rode on bikes and scooters and worked together to make dens and roads.
