



Dates for your diary:

Tuesday 28th March is our Easter 'stay and play' session.

The morning 'stay and play' session (for the morning children and the 30-hour children) will be 10.30am. The afternoon 'stay and play' session (for the afternoon children) will be at 2.15pm. If you are unable to attend the session a family member/friend can attend in your place. At this session, you/carer will work with your child to make an Easter hat. We kindly ask that babies/toddlers do not attend.

Your child will wear the Easter hat that they make at our Nursery Easter Parade on **Friday 31st March 2023 at 11am (for the morning children and the 30-hour children) & 2.45pm** (for the afternoon children). You are all invited to come and watch our Easter parade.

Can we please remind everyone to label your child's clothing and shoes. Lots of cardigans and jumpers are getting lost! If you write your child's name in their clothing with a pen, please keep checking the label to make sure that your child's name hasn't washed off.

Books: Reading is a top priority across Lee Brigg School. We want all of our children to foster a love of reading. In nursery, we offer a library lending service. Please support your child in choosing a book to take home. Starting a reading routine early, sets young children up to continue reading and enjoying stories as they grow. It will improve their vocabulary, language and comprehension skills and they are more likely to do well at school.

This week's learning: Our key text was 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea.' Our key vocabulary was: furry, stripy, supper, evening, morning, grocer, waiter, waitress and café. Please try and use these words at home.

We have learnt facts about tigers, and learnt a 'tiger' number rhyme 5 big tigers.

Tearing paper to make the tigers stripes was our 'funky finger' activity, Activities like this help to strengthen the children's fingers in preparation for writing.
