Tuesday 28th March is our Easter 'stay and play' session. The morning 'stay and play' session (for the morning children and the 30-hour children) will be at 10.30am. The afternoon 'stay and play' session (for the afternoon children) will be 2.30pm. If you are unable to attend the session a family member/friend can attend in your place.
