# Directory of Domestic Abuse Support

**Strategic Domestic Abuse Team** 

As a professional working within the Wakefield District, you will likely know someone who has been affected by domestic abuse. It may be that you undertake a role specifically designed to support people, or that you know someone personally, a friend, family member or colleague who may need support.

Supporting someone to access co-ordinated, professional advice and help can be lifesaving. This directory provides details of a number of local and national services and organisations that are available to offer support for victims, perpetrators and children affected by domestic abuse.

# Local support for adult victims of domestic abuse

 Wakefield District Domestic Abuse Service (WDDAS) www.wakefield.gov.uk/domesticabuse 0800 915 1561 A comprehensive specialist service providing a range of support to victims of domestic abuse. Support includes, Safety Planning, Housing information and advice, Sanctuary Scheme, support for those in Safe Accommodation including children, emotional support and access to the Freedom Programme.

WDDAS provide a single point of contact for all referrals and provide a telephone advice line available to members of the public and professionals. Agency and self-referrals can be made to WDDAS for all levels of risk.

This service is for anyone who may need help inclusive of age, gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, or nationality. If English is not the first language an interpreter will be provided, or arrangements made to ensure services can be provided. Contact email address <u>domesticabuse@wakefield.gov.uk</u>

- WDDAS 'clinics' are available across the district in the Family Hub's in Castleford, Normanton, Hemsworth and Wakefield. The purpose of the 'clinics' is to:
  - Provide advice and guidance to colleagues in supporting assessments and delivery of services for victims of domestic abuse.
  - Provide a point of contact for other partner agencies and offer support and guidance.
  - Give advice and help to other professionals in completing the DASH and how to refer to MARAC
  - Provide advice on the support WDDAS offer
  - Share resources and information
  - Be available to see victims of domestic abuse who are already working with other services to promote the service of WDDAS to help gain consent for a referral in to WDDAS.

- Freedom Programme is a 12 week group work programme for victims of domestic abuse to help them understand their experience and learn about the dynamic of an abusive relationship. Groups are being delivered across the district by the Family Hub working in partnership with WDDAS. Referrals to the Freedom Programme are to be requested on a WDDAS referral form. - Who's In Charge is a 9-week programme provided by Wakefield Youth Offending Team aimed at supporting parents who experience abusive and challenging behaviours from their children. For further information and to make a referral please contact **01924 304155**.

This voluntary sector service works with victims, perpetrators, young people, children and families through all forms of abusive behaviour including domestic abuse.    A women's only service providing a wide range of emotional, therapeutic, and practical support for women age 16+ in Wakefield. Casework and Counselling is available, as is The Freedom Programme which may be beneficial for women who are or have experienced domestic abuse. The Casework offer includes dedicated domestic abuse support to help identify the most relevant services.

The group is a safe space for women who live in the Wakefield district who have experienced domestic abuse to come together, chat and support one another.

The group aims to support women who are aged 18 + years who have experienced domestic abuse and would benefit from Peer-to-Peer support.

## Support available for perpetrators of domestic abuse

Help and support for people who are using abusive behaviours are either voluntary – when the person chooses to get help to change, or statutory, where there is a requirement to complete a programme. These are often referred to as Perpetrator Programmes – all perpetrator work has the aim of reducing the impact of domestic abuse on the victims and maximising safety while supporting the abuser to make changes in their behaviour.

- Probation Service Wakefield 01924 853260 The Probation Service is
  responsible for supervising all people on probation including those convicted
  of domestic abuse offences. The Probation Service delivers accredited
  programmes and structured interventions with the aim of challenging abusive
  behaviour and supporting individuals to recognise the triggers to their
  offending and to address these. The Probation Service is also able to refer
  people to commissioned rehabilitative services for support with
  accommodation, education, training and employment and personal wellbeing.

This is not a perpetrator intervention but may help someone get ready to access the help they need.

Any man is welcome, groups are running in Castleford, Hemsworth, Pontefract, Wakefield, check website for details. This is not a perpetrator intervention but can offer a safe space to discuss difficult feelings and may be a supportive step to getting professional help around the use of abusive behaviours.

The aim is to support families to leave the

programme with methods for handling problems and conflict that will prevent further instances of violence and abuse by young people. Families with children aged 10 -17 years can access up to 8 sessions of remote support

**Reporting option** - West Yorkshire Police have created a simple online form to allow victims to report domestic abuse, as an alternative to speaking on the phone. The information provided will be dealt with in the same way as any other report of domestic abuse. <u>You can find the form here</u>.

The Local Crime Tracker keeps the victim updated with the status of the crime and details of the officer dealing with the case.

**WYFEAT** – West Yorkshire Financial Exploitation and Abuse Team – <u>https://wyjs.org.uk</u> This is a multi-agency task force dealing with all aspects of fraud, scams, doorstep crime and financial abuse and exploitation by family members. If you are working with a victim of domestic abuse who is experiencing economic and financial abuse, this service may be able to help.
