



As part of our topic 'Ready Steady Grow,' we will be learning about plants. We would like to create a plant display to promote scientific language. This will help the children to learn how to care for a variety of plants. We would like the children to explore lots of different plants and therefore ask for any donations of indoor plants (large and small). We kindly ask that you bring your plants into nursery next week.

This week's learning: Our key text was 'When I Was a Baby/So Much'. Our key vocabulary related to human growth and our 'wow' word was 'human'!

We have looked at the children's baby photos and talked about how they had changed. They enjoyed trying to guess who each baby was!

The children enjoyed making (healthy) chips! The peeling and the chopping strengthened the children's fine motor skills.

Farmer Dean came in to the 'candle' the eggs, "Candling" an egg is the process of holding a light or candle near the egg to see the inner contents. It is used to see whether the egg is fertile or not. We are pleased to say that we have lots of fertile eggs. The chicks should begin to hatch on Tuesday May 9th (fingers crossed).
