

## Tiger cubs (nursery) Newsletter 32 (June 22<sup>nd</sup> 2023)



This week's learning: We revisited the text 'Eat Up Gemma' (a story about a baby who was very mischievous). We have focused on naming the days of the week and talking about different times of the day such as morning, afternoon and night.

We have been scientists! The caterpillars are now in their cocoons (we are now waiting for metamorphosis to take place). Metamorphosis has already happened with the tadpoles, as they are now froglets. We have used the marbles, pom poms and ramps to explore movement and force.

We have been artists! The children have been developing their printing skills. They have become familiar with the materials and equipment that are needed for printing, such as sponges and rollers. Printing also allows the children to explore cause and effect such as what happens when a child changes the amount of pressure applied while making the same print more than once or which objects make the best prints, and why?

We have also learnt about the musician Evelyn Glennie and explored the sounds of the xylophone (one of the instruments that Evelyn plays).
