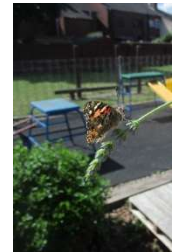
'So Much' is a joyful celebration of family life. The text uses repeated phrases, sing-song rhythms and Caribbean dialect. Once again, we discussed human growth and our wow word was 'human'.

We released our four butterflies and discovered that 'metamorphosis' had taken place with our playdough caterpillars. (Mrs Windsor did the magic!)

The children followed verbal instructions to make a sandwich. We used the vocabulary spread, cut, half, and wrap. We got to take our sandwiches outside to eat!
