



This week, we discussed sun safety and wrote sentences to describe how we keep safe in the sun. We wrote sentences about creatures who live in the ocean and looked at our friends' sentences to see how we could make them even better. We use 'Magic 5' hands to check we have remembered everything!!

- Have I used a capital letter?
- Have I left spaces between my words?
- Is my writing sitting neatly on the line?
- Does it make sense? (check I haven't missed any sounds out)
- Have I used a full stop?

When your child is practising writing at home, please remind them of this!

We have now learned all the phase 2 and 3 sounds and all the phase 2, 3 and 4 tricky words. Please keep practising these at home (key rings) to ensure your child is ready to move forward with their learning in Year 1! We are now learning to read longer words including words with suffixes (including swimming, green, strong, scrunch and fantastic). Please remind children of our reading routine when reading at home: spot the digraph/trigraph, say the sounds and read the word.

In maths, we practised our doubles to 10 and made them using different resources.

We watched **'Orange feels worried'** and discussed how we all sometimes feel worried and how it is natural to feel worried about moving into another class.
